# **Key Highlights**



66.62 million were exported in September 2021 at an average weighted price of US\$ 1.90 /kilo, 11 cents higher than US\$ 1.79 /kilo in August 2021. This was an increase of 16% and 50% in quantity and value respectively compared to the same month last year. Farm-gate prices for Robusta Kiboko averaged UGX 2,650 per kilo; FAQ UGX 5,150 per kilo, Arabica

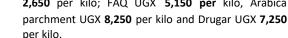




Coffee exports for 12 months (Coffee year 2020/21) totaled 6.49 million bags worth US 629.89 million compared to 5.36 million bags worth US\$ 512.22 million the previous year (Coffee year 2019/2020). This represents an increase of 21% and 23% in both quantity and value respectively.

83% of the total volume was exported by 10 exporters. out of 40 companies which performed during the month compared to 80% in August 2021.

Bugisu AB fetched the highest price at US \$ 4.03 per kilo.





The ICO Composite Indicator price increased by 6.2% to 170.02 US cents/lb. in September 2021 from US cents/lb. 160.14 US cents/lb. in August 2021.

## I. Coffee exports

Coffee exports in September 2021 amounted to 585,576 60kilo bags worth US\$ 66.62 million as shown in Fig 1. This comprised 543,279 bags of Robusta valued at US \$59.93 million and 42,297 bags of Arabica valued at US\$ 6.69 million (see Table 1 and Annex 1). This was an increase of 15.82% and 49.56% in quantity and value respectively compared to the same month last year.

By comparing quantity of coffee exported by type in the same month of last Coffee Year (September 2020), Robusta increased by 22.16% and 61.16% in quantity and value respectively. Arabica exports on the hand decreased by 30.48% and 9.07% in quantity and value respectively.

Increasing Robusta exports during the month compared to use previous year were due to newly planted coffee which started yielding supported by favorable weather. This was also resitive trend in global coffee prices in the threat of frost and the threat of frost and the threat of frost and the threat of the th drought, which prompted exporters to release their stocks. The decrease in Arabica coffee exports is a result of the off-year biennial cycle.

Coffee exports for the 12 months (Coffee year 2020/21) amounted to 6,494,691 60-kilo bags worth US\$ 629.89 million compared to 5,359,970-kilo bags valued at US\$ 512.22 million the previous year (Coffee year 2019/20). This represents 21.17% and 22.97% increase in both quantity and value respectively (Figure 1). Total export quantity in 12 months was the highest in 30 years.

# 2. Exports by Type and Grade

**Table 2** shows coffee exports by type, grade and average realized price for each grade during the month of September 2021. The average export price was US\$ 1.90 per kilo, 11 cents higher than US\$ 1.79 per kilo realized in August 2021. Robusta exports accounted for 93% of total exports higher than 91% in August 2021. The average Robusta price was US\$ 1.84 per kilo, 13 cents higher than the previous month. Washed Robusta, Screen 18 Organic, Screen 15 Organic and Screen 15 Fairtrade fetched the highest price of US\$ 2.23 per kilo, a premium of 33 and 37 cents over conventional Screen 18 and Screen 15 respectively. It was followed by Screen 14 Organic sold at an average price of US\$ 2.12 per kilo. The share of Sustainable/washed coffee to total Robusta exports was only 1.14%.

Arabica fetched an average price of US\$ 2.63 per kilo, 9 cents higher than in August 2021. The highest price was for Bugisu AB at US\$ 4.03 per kilo, and was followed by Wugar and Bugisu AA sold at US\$ 3.87 and 3.85 per kilo respectively. Drugar was sold at US\$ 3.08 per kilo, a discount of 77 cents from Bugisu AA. Drugar exports had a 41% of Arabica exports compared to 23% the previous month.

The share of sustainable Arabica exports to total Arabica exports was very low (0.76%.) due to the fact that the crop last season was poor.

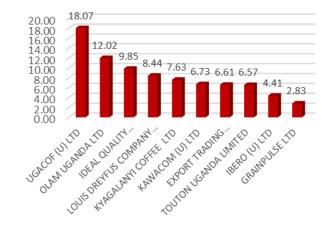

#### 3. Individual Exporter Performance

Figure 2 shows the top 10 export companies in the month of September 2021. Ugacof (U) Ltd had the highest market share of 18.07% compared to 15.45% in August 2021. It was followed by Olam Uganda Ltd 12.02% (11.09%); Ideal Quality Commodities (U) Ltd 9.85% (9.73%); Louis Dreyfus Company (U) Ltd 8.44% (8.42%) Kyagalanyi Coffee Ltd 7.63% (5.61%); Kawacom (U) Ltd 6.73% (9.96%); Export Trading Company Ltd 6.61% (4.44%); Touton Uganda Limited 6.57% (6.72%); Ibero (U) Ltd 4.41% (4.30%) and Grainpulse Ltd 2.83% (3.39%) \*The figures in brackets represent percentage market share held in August 2021. The top 10 exporters held a market share of 83% compared to 80% the previous month. There were changes in positions compared to last month reflecting competition at the exporter level. Out of the 40 exporters that performed, 18 exported Robusta Coffee only while 6 exported Arabica coffee only. Annex 2 shows a detailed list of exporters' performance in September 2021.

# Foreign buyers of Uganda Coffee

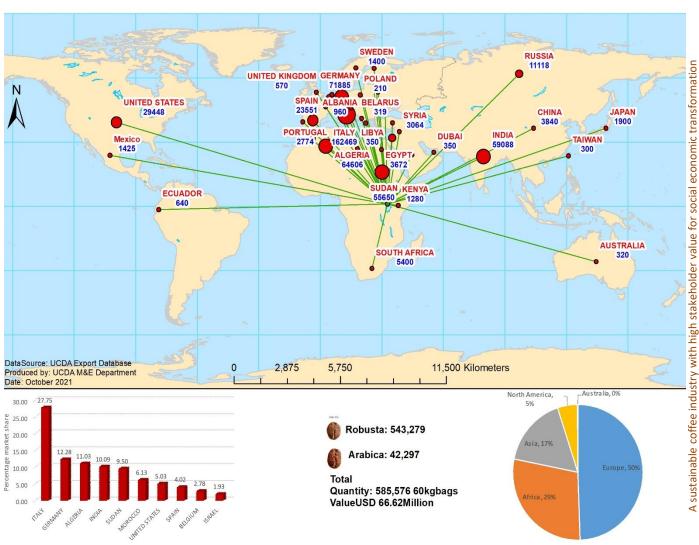
Annex 4 shows a list of Ugandan coffee foreign buyers in September 2021. The top 10 buyers held a market share of 66% of total exports, higher than 60% the previous month. Sucafina led with a market share of 17.83% compared to 15.30% in August 2021. It was followed by Olam International 14.55% (12.05%); Louis Dreyfus 6.75%; Ecom Agro Industrial 6.27% (10.82%); Volcafe 5.26% (2.74%); Bernhard Rothfos 4.41% (4.44%); Altasheel Import and Export Enterprises 4.00% (3.94%); Nestle South Africa 3.11%, Hamburg Coffee 2.39% (2.85%) and Sarl Conaagral 1.84% Note: The figures in brackets represent percentage performance in the previous month - August 2021.

There were changes in relative position of the first ten major buyers compared to the previous month with 2 new buyers occupying the first 10 positions reflecting increasing demand for Uganda coffee abroad.

 Coffee Exports By Destination
 The destinations of Uganda's coffee exports during the
month of September 2021 are shown in Fig 3 (details in Annex 3). Italy maintained the highest market share with 27.75% compared with 34.02% last month. It was followed by Germany 12.28% (13.39%), Algeria 11.03% (10.22%) India 10.09% (7.76%) and Sudan 9.50% (10.43%). \*The figures in brackets represent percentage market share held in August 2021.

Coffee exports to Africa amounted to 164,024 bags, a market share of 29% compared to 169,383 bags (24%) the previous month. African countries included Algeria, Sudan, Morocco, Kenya,, Egypt, and South Africa. Europe remained the main destination for Uganda's coffees with a 50% imports share although lower than 61% in August 2021.



#### 6. Global Situation

World coffee exports for August totaled 10.12 million bags down by 0.1% from 10.13 million bags in August 2020. Total exports for 11 months of Coffee year 2020/21 totaled 118.96 million bags a 1.9% increase compared to 116.77 million bags for the 11 months of coffee year 2019/20. The ICO Composite Indicator price increased by 6.2% to 170.02 US cents up from 160.14US cents in August 2021. The prices have seen a positive trend since October as concerns of supply continue due to adverse weather conditions in Brazil and supply disruption caused by shortage of containers and Covid-19 pandemic restrictions in Asia. Global coffee production for 2020/21 coffee year is estimated to increase by 0.4% to 169.64 million bags a 0.4% up from 168.98 million bags in Coffee Year 2019/20. Global consumption is estimated to increase by 1.9% % to 167.26 million bags in 2020/21 coffee year compared to 164.13 million bags in 2019/20 coffee year (ICO September 2021 report).

### 7. Local Situation

During the month of September 2021, farm gate prices ranged from Sh.2,500-2,800/= per kilo of Kiboko (Robusta dry cherries); Shs. 4,800-5,500/= for FAQ; Sh. 8,000-8,500= for Arabica parchment; and Sh. 7,000-7,500/= per kilo for Drugar from Kasese. Robusta Kiboko averaged UGX 2,650/= per kilo; FAQ UGX 5,150/= per kilo, Arabica parchment UGX 8,250/= per kilo and Drugar UGX 7,250/= per kilo.

# 8. Coffee Development and Promotional Activities

During the month of September, 2021, many parts of the country received near normal rains favoring seedling distribution and survival rates. A cumulative of 7,959 kg of Arabica seed was distributed across Arabica regions to 180 nursery operators (131M, 49F & 1Y): Elgon received 1,559kgs of seed to 88 nursery operators (54M, 34F, 1Y), Rwenzori, 2,200k to 53 operators (43M, 10F). In South West, a total of 2,200kg was allocated to 28 nursery operators (23M, 5Y); In West Nile, 1000 Arabica seed was distributed to 11 nursery operators (11M, 2Y). Meanwhile, arabica seedlings totaling to 16,284,000 were allocated to Arabica regions for Sept- November planting season. Elgon received 7,000 seedlings; Rwenzori 10,400,000; and South Western received 5,877,000. Mid North region was allocated 10,000 Elite Robusta coffee seedlings. Regarding CWDr cuttings, 22,400 plantlets were procured and distributed to 11 CWD-r mother gardens benefiting (9M and 2F) as follows: 5,600 CWD-r plantlets in Central, 2,100 in Rwenzori, 2,100 in South Western and 12,600 plantlets in Western. A total of 3,930,182 plantlets were distributed to 766 coffee farmers (665M, 101F) of 5 acres and above across central region with 941,431 CWDr; 350,000 plantlets to Eastern; 751,025 plantlets to Greater Masaka; 544,800 to Rwenzori; 690,880 plantlets to South Western and 652,046 plantlets to Western. Meanwhile, 119,050 CWD-r plantlets was procured & distributed to Religious Institutions (Dioceses -Church Parishes & Archdeaconries) for establishment of CWD-r plantations and demonstration gardens on Church land. Registration of processing facilities and enforcement of coffee quality standards and regulations continued during the month. Elgon registered 15 store, 2 roasters and 3 wet mills. In Rwenzori 112 stores and 21 factories were inspected. A total of 17 stores and 21 factories were closed for non compliance. In South West, 46 factories and 25 buying stores were issued with marketing licenses, while 26 stores and factories were suspended. In Western, 6 new primary coffee processing factories were constructed and installed. A total of 116 hullers and 65 stores were registered across the region, while 45 factories and 3 roasters were inspected to ascertain compliance standards. Countrywide, 47,600 kgs of Copper Nodox, 125,000 Sackets (20 grams) of Imidachloprid, and 52,000 bottles (100mls) of Tebuconazole were distributed to different regions. Meanwhile, a cumulative of 414,524 coffee trees for 1,829 coffee farmers (1,551M, 278F) were stumped. Coffee stumping was majorly implemented in three (3) regions: Rwenzori 16,680 trees for 142 beneficiaries (117M & 25F); South Western, 35,914 old coffee trees for 236 farmers (198M and 38F). In Western, a total of 361,930 trees were stumped for 1,451 farmers (1,236M, 215F); meanwhile, a total of 67,769 bags of bamboo bio char fertilizer were delivered in the store in Hoima ready for distribution in the entire region of western.

#### 9. Outlook for October 2021

Coffee exports are projected to be 500,000 bags as the main harvesting period in Greater Masaka and South Western regions has virtually ended. During the month, rains may affect the transportation of the little coffee remaining in the rural areas. Harvesting season in central region will start in October.
